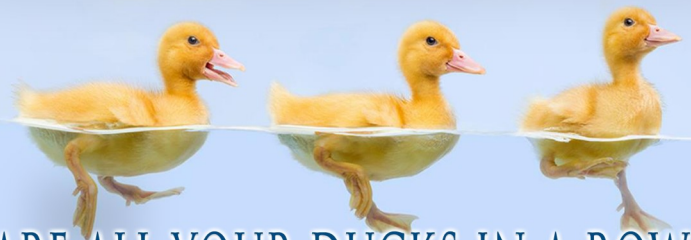

BOOK REVIEW:

Are you tired of the gloom and doom surrounding climate change? There is hope in The Future is Now by Bob McDonald, host of CBC radio's 'Quirks and Quarks'. Bob explains Solar Power, Wind Power, Bio-fuels, Ocean Wave Power, Geothermal Energy, Nuclear Power, Hydrogen Power. He talks candidly about the disasters of the past, including Hiroshima and the Hindenberg. He explains each power source and how it works, including illustrations.

Did You Know ...

- the sun's energy is so powerful the world could meet all its electricity needs on solar power alone?
- each gallon of corn ethanol delivers 67% more energy than is used to produce it? There are also biofuel sources in food waste, forest waste, agricultural waste.
- wind power has been used from ancient to modern times to fill sails to cross seas and to pump water with windmills?
- nuclear power is safer than any other form of power, having caused the equivalent of the death of only 1 person every 14 years? (not including Hiroshima - explained in the nuclear power chapter)

- Many small, remote and poor countries are using many of these forms of energy already because they do not have accessibility to gas & oil and/or are too poor to get it.

The book includes information on energy storage and carbon capture and using oil more efficiently in a way that doesn't release harmful elements into the atmosphere. Each type of power has advantages and disadvantages; both are given equal billing in this book.

Now that climate change is with us, money is being poured into the development of technology for clean energy. Many different energy sources are already being used in some countries and many other possibilities are being tested and will be put into use in the near future. An exciting time is near at hand!

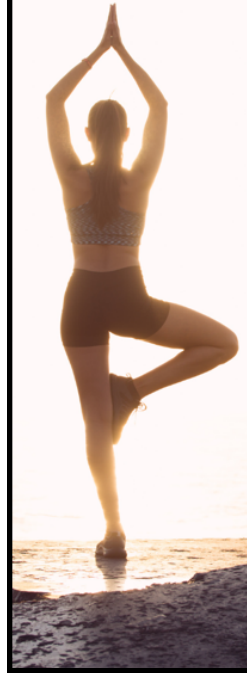

Council would like to remind everyone pushing snow to please refrain from piling snow from yards across the grid roads and/or piling along the edge of the grid. These piles get hard and cause a lot of damage and liability issues if they are hit. If it is found that you are piling snow along the road - you will be billed for the entire cost of relocating the pile off of the municipal right of way.

BE RESPECTFUL:

The RM is experiencing issues with ratepayers taking their complaints directly to councillors at their residence. While the Council welcome constructive conversations with their neighbors, please respect everyone's personal boundaries by following the chain of command to follow. Verbal abuse and threatening behaviour will not be tolerated.

WHO YOU SHOULD CALL:

There have been some questions as to whom you – as a landowner of the municipality – should call IF you have any concerns about municipal issues. Here is the correct chain of command the Council are asking you to follow – (1) Your first phone call should be to your Division Councillor (not the neighboring division councillor). Your councillor will be most familiar with your division and is the person that deals with the issues in your area. IF they can't solve your problem – they will bring the issue to the whole of council and the Council will work to find a resolution to your problem; (2) IF you aren't able to contact your councillor, then you should phone Reeve Marty Botterill @ 306-434-8167 who will bring your concerns to the Council of the Whole on your behalf; and finally (3) If you still haven't talked to anyone – then please phone the Municipal Office at 306-646-2033 - your concern(s) will be presented to the Council at the next regular meeting. Council requests that you please do your best in following these simple guidelines.

TAX PAYMENTS:

All 2022 taxes were due and payable on or before December 31, 2022. If you have outstanding taxes due, you should have received a notice in the mail by now. Please make every effort to pay the balance owing before January 31, 2023. Any tax accounts

still owing after January month end will be presented to the head of Council at the February 10, 2023 Council meeting and a tax lien will be registered on the property soon after that. To avoid extra charges being added to your account, please call the Municipal Office to find out the exact amount owing prior to sending a cheque.
