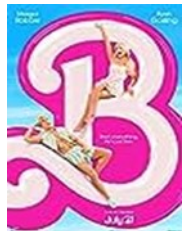

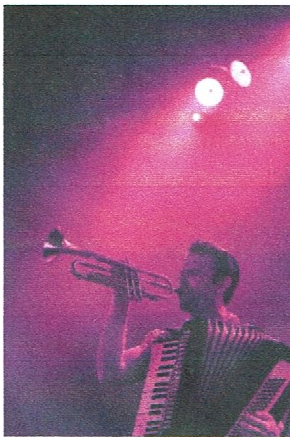
Diyet and the Love Soldiers Monday, October 30, 2023

Fair Blog 1



This blog will be about showing your exhibits, some hopefully helpful hints so that you can feel confident in entering your exhibits in the Maryfield Fair.

Provincial governments used to provide standards for a multitude of products & animals that could be entered in Fairs; judges had to take a course in judging so that they would know what to look for. As the demands on governments have increased, they have dropped the Standards books and the judges' courses.

Some 'hints' come from standards books I have seen, some from judges when they write a note on my entry tag, some from other exhibitors, some from seeing the winning entries to figure out how to do mine differently.

Hint: Raspberries - Presentation Counts! Raspberries should all be of a similar size. Larger is better but only if they are all close in size. Raspberries must be snipped from the plant so that the stem is left on. The raspberries should be firmly attached to the stem i.e. they should not look as if they are ready to fall off. Hopefully, they are of the same ripeness. Usually they will ripen overnight or even in a couple of hours. More is not necessarily better - I use 20 as my idea of the right number, on a plate just big enough to hold them.

TEMPORARY &/OR ELECTRIC FENCE

Temporary &/or Electric fences are being left in the ditches and not being cleaned up which cause more mower down time. Please be advised that if you have electric fence on the side of the road or in the ditch bottoms, you are responsible for cleaning it up. 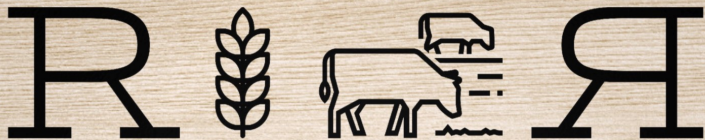
