BROCCOLI CHICKEN CASSEROLE - HAVE IT TONIGHT, TOSS IT IN THE FREEZER OR LUNCH TOMORROW!

- 8 ounces uncooked pasta
- 1 large head of broccoli, cut into bite-sized florets (or a bag of frozen)
- · 2 tablespoons butter or olive oil
- · 1 small white onion, thinly sliced
- · 8 ounces mushrooms, thinly sliced, or canned
- 4 cloves garlic, minced
- 3 tablespoons flour
- . 1 cup chicken or vegetable stock
- 11/2 cups milk
- 1 teaspoon Dijon mustard
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- · 2 cups (8 ounces) shredded sharp cheddar cheese, divided
- 2 cups diced (or shredded) cooked chicken (sub canned if needed)

- Preheat oven to 400. Cook pasta in a pot of salted boiling water until it
 is al dente. However, about 1 minute before the pasta is done, add the
 broccoli to the boiling pasta water and stir until combined. Drain both
 the pasta and broccoli, and set aside.
- Heat the butter (or oil) in a large pan over medium-high heat. Add the onion, sauté for 3 minutes, stirring occasionally. Add the mushrooms & garlic and sauté for 5 more minutes, stirring occasionally, or until the mushrooms are cooked through.
- Sprinkle the flour over the onion mixture, stir until combined. Cook for 1 minute. Add in the stock, stir, add in the milk, Dijon, salt and pepper, stir until combined. Continue cooking the sauce until it reaches a simmer. Remove from heat and stir in 1 cup of the shredded cheese until it is combined. Taste and season with additional salt and pepper, if needed
- Bake in a 9x13 pan uncovered for 15 minutes, remove from oven, sprinkle with cheese, bake for ten more minutes, enjoy!





Maryfield Rink Lounge Project Upgrade




