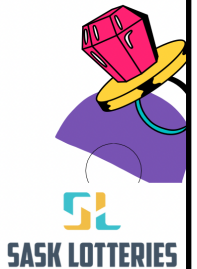

WHAT IS HAPPENING AT THE CLINIC?

Starting June 8, 2023—Kristin Canart, Nurse Practitioner, will be in clinic most Thursdays. She can provide a wide range of services, including prescription renewals, physicals, prenatal care, driver's medicals, IUD care, chronic disease management, etc. Please call the clinic for an appointment.

Monday/Tuesday/Wednesday—Cherrie Naylen, Registered Nurse, or Michelle Luscombe, Registered Nurse is here for the morning to complete bloodwork, ECG's, dressing changes, blood pressure checks, etc. If you are requiring an appointment with our RN's, please call the clinic.

Pharmasave Moosomin delivers medications to Maryfield area Tuesdays and Fridays. You can request to have your prescriptions dropped off at the clinic for pickup.

There is a job posting online for a permanent Nurse Practitioner to be shared between Maryfield and Wawota. We do not know what that schedule will look like. Once the position is filled, we will have that information.

We understand this can be a challenging time to find medical care in a timely manner. With the current patient demand, we are seeing a wait of 1-6 weeks to see a provider. We are doing our best to help all our patients, but we need your help to make it work as smoothly as possible! Please be sure to keep track of your prescription renewals. When you are down to 1 or 2 refills left, please **call to book an appointment** with a provider. Our providers cannot accommodate requests to fill prescriptions without an in-person or telephone appointment scheduled for you. Please call the clinic for any assistance you may need.

If you cannot get an appointment in a timely manner for something that cannot wait, Saskatchewan residents do have a couple of online options as well. These are fee-for-service sites: getmaple.ca ; gotodoctor.ca ; justananswer.com . If you are a Manitoba resident, there is no charge for gotodoctor.ca. Please remember we also have a great resource by calling 811.

Please call the clinic for any assistance or with any questions you may have.

DUST CONTROL:

The dust control program for 2023 will be underway shortly. If you are wanting dust control on your frontage, you **MUST** call the office at 306-646-2033 for instructions and sign a new waiver form. Dust control is scheduled to be put on mid June.

DIVISION FIVE COUNCILLOR VACANCIES:

A Call for Nominations will be posted June 13th with the deadline to receive nominations being on Wednesday, June 28, 2023. If necessary, a By-Election will be held on Wednesday, August 2, 2023.

EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES:

The RM Council is accepting resumes until Noon June 7th, 2023 for a full-time Summer Student &/or Seasonal operator. Detailed job postings are listed on our website. Those who are interested can submit their resume either in person to the RM office or email rm91@sasktel.net on or before the deadline above.

“NEW” POLICY REMINDERS – check RM Website for documents in their entirety:

- (1) **ROAD BYLAW:** The new Bylaw stipulates that either written or verbal approval must be obtained from the Council prior to any work being done in a municipal road allowance. If damage is done to a road allowance and council determines that it creates an emergent danger to the public – the Municipality will repair the damage and may add any costs incurred in eliminating the emergency to the tax roll in respect of which the person causing the emergency is the assessed person.
- (2) **DEVELOPMENT PERMITS:** Please remember if you are putting up any structures on your property you are required to have a development permit. If you are thinking of putting up a structure, house, bins or sheds please come to the office and fill out the paper work so it can be approved at the next regular meeting of the Council.
- (3) **BUILDING BYLAW:** The new Building Bylaw is now in effect - Building standards apply to any residential occupancy on Agricultural land. If you are building or renovating a new dwelling, a basement development, a deck, or a garage to serve as an accessory to the dwelling, a building permit is required for these projects.

SASK MUNICIPAL HAIL INSURANCE:

(1) MUNICIPAL HAIL INSURANCE (SMHI):

- Continuous Hail insurance coverage up to \$425 per acre, premiums are paid as taxes allowing for early payment discounts;
- Crop Report deadline is June 15th –New application deadline is June 30th;
- Annual Crop Reports have now been mailed out – please fill in the acreage and coverage wanted & either file online or return your form to the RM office; and
- If you have questions or would like to purchase additional coverage, please contact the municipal office at 646-2033.

(2) ADDITIONAL HAIL INSURANCE (AMHI):

- Annual policy application and deadline to apply is August 1st;
- Provides coverage on crops on rented land or additional coverage on land already insured by SMHI but coverage with SMHI is not required;
- Premiums paid at time of application - cheque, credit card (Visa/MasterCard); and
- Indemnities up to \$500.00/acre (conditions may apply).

SASK. MUNICIPAL HAIL - \$1000 SCHOLARSHIPS

SMHI supports the next generation of smart minds through their Municipal Hail Insurance Scholarships. 5 scholarships are awarded annually in July to students enrolled in a university or technical institute in the Province of Saskatchewan and are a dependent of a client, an employee or an agent of Municipal Hail. Please visit www.rmofmaryfield.com and go to **Maps & Links** to download an application form. Successful applicants will be notified by July 31st.

CONTROL BURN NUMBER

If you are going to be burning **PLEASE CALL THE CONTROL BURN** number **1-866-404-4911**. If the fire department should get called out **YOU WILL BE BILLED A MINIMUM CALL OUT FEE!** In the event there is a Fire Ban in our RM - you will not be given permission for a control burn therefore should the fire department be dispatched you **WILL** be billed!

NOXIOUS WEEDS

The weed inspector will be out to do a check of the municipality for noxious weeds in the near future. Weeds found in past years have been Leafy Spurge, Scentsless Camomile, Common Tansy, as well as some Wild Parsnip. If you happen to find a patch please don't hesitate to give the office a call with the land location and we will send the inspector out to have a look at it!

MOWING OF DITCHES

It is the intent of the R.M. of Maryfield to start the 2023 mowing program towards the end of June this year, weather dependent. If you are planning on cutting the

ditches for the purpose of haying them, it would be greatly appreciated if you could advise us of the locations that you will be cutting. ***Please be aware*** that when we are mowing - the municipality will be mowing a minimum of 15 feet from the road – if you are farming the ditches – your crop will be cut down.

FARM EQUIPMENT IN DITCHES

The R.M. of Maryfield is asking everyone to please use approaches to enter fields. We have been informed of a number very large ruts in the ditches caused by equipment. If you have accidentally put ruts in the ditches please clean them up as soon as possible as we will be beginning our mowing program. With increased ruts comes increase costs of repairs and more down time thus the ditches will not get mowed. Should the RM have to clean up ruts from people not using the approaches we will be charging for the cost of cleanup.

ELECTRIC FENCE

Electric fences are being left and not cleaned up and causing more mower down time. Please be advised if you have electric fence and it is in the ditch bottoms you are responsible for cleaning it up. Should our mower or equipment become entangled in the fence you will be billed for the machine time, any repairs necessary and personnel time it takes to clean it out of the equipment.

GARBAGE/RECYCLE BINS

Loraas is permitted to accept only solid, non-hazardous waste materials including general household garbage, food, yard and garden waster, etc. They DO NOT accept any regulated waste such as: hazardous waste, medical waste, pressure-filled containers, paint, used oil or containers, or electronics. Please be diligent in using the Garbage and Recycle bins properly. We do not want to loose this service by having the bins removed from the municipality. ALSO, ensure the lids are closed every time - so that garbage is not blowing around the area.

EMAIL LIST

The RM is once again looking for Emergency Measures information to be updated, this includes emails and cell phone numbers to be used to contact you in case of an emergency.

- Adjusted losses of 85 and over are paid at 100 less the deductible.

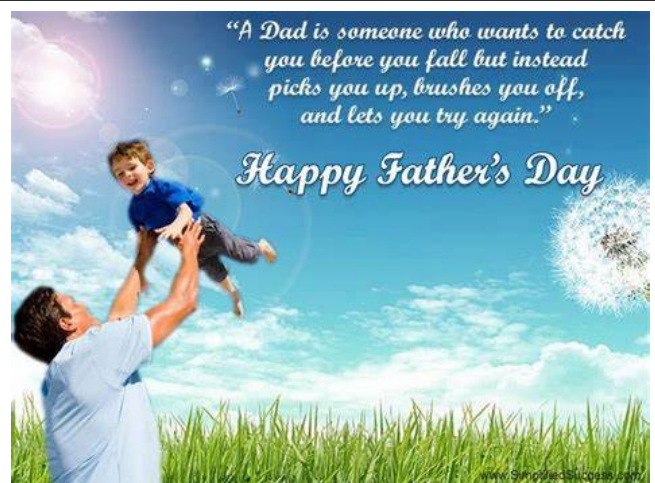
Additional Municipal Hail Insurance
