





Maryfield is Home to Many Hockey Players



Daniel played his first year of U18 in Redvers this year.




Kenzy played in an all girls' league for the first time this year for the Carlyle Cougars u17. They finished 7th in the league and got knocked out in the first round.

ROAD RESTRICTION ORDER 6-23:

IN ACCORDANCE with Bylaw No. 13-95 of the Rural Municipality of Maryfield No. 91 and with regulations prescribed under *The Municipalities Act* NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that effective on the 20th day of April, 2023 at 3:30 p.m. and until further notice, <u>ALL</u> municipal roadways shall have the operation of vehicles restricted to 15,000 lbs. (6818 Kg), including the load.

PENALTY – Any person guilty of any infraction to any of the provisions of this order shall, upon summary conviction, be liable to a fine as per Bylaw No. 2/2014 being A Bylaw to Establish Penalties for Contravention of Bylaws within the Rural Municipality of Maryfield. No. 91.

2023 ASSESSMENT ROLL IS NOW OPEN:

The 2023 Assessment Roll is now open until 5:00 pm on Tuesday, May 8, 2023. In accordance with Bylaw No. 8/2003, assessment notices have only been sent out in cases where the assessed value in respect of land or improvements is new or was altered since the Province wide revaluation in 2021. 2022 the RM of Maryfield saw a complete re-inspection of our municipality.

2023 BUDGET, MILL RATE & V.M.R.F.:

The 2023 Budget has now adopted the budget for 2023 and Council has set the Mill Rate at 11 mills for 2023. The Council also passed Bylaw 04/2023 Being a Bylaw to Establish Variable Mill Rate Factors for Classes of Property within the Rural Municipality of Maryfield No. 91 as follows:

Agricultural Land
Residential Land
Commercial Land
Commercial Land
0.6000 times the uniform mill rate
1.0000 times the uniform mill rate

DEVELOPMENT PERMITS & BUILDING PERMITS:

This is a reminder that If you are planning on building anything on your property, you are required to apply to the RM for a "Development Permit" for review by the development officer and/or the Council.

If you are planning on building a new dwelling, a basement development, a deck, or a garage to serve as an accessory to your dwelling, then you are also required to apply for a building permit. Building standards apply to any building with residential occupancy on Agricultural land.

ROAD BYLAW: REMINDER:

Please check out the RM website for the complete document. Council reiterates that either written or verbal approval must be obtained from the Council prior to <u>any</u> work being done within a municipal road allowance or to

a municipal road. If damage is done within our road allowance and council determines that it creates an emergent danger to the public – the RM will repair the damage and may add any costs incurred in eliminating the emergency to the tax roll in respect of which the person causing the emergency is the assessed person.

2023 GRAVEL PROGRAM:

The 2023 road gravelling season will start soon! If you are planning on getting gravel in your yard or on lane, please call the RM Office at 306-646-2033 so that we can co-ordinate with the Gravel Haulers to ensure that you will be getting the requested gravel in an orderly fashion. The current cost for crushed gravel is \$12.00 per cubic yard plus the cost of hauling the gravel. Please note the RM has changed their policy so that Ratepayers of the Village of Fairlight and the Village of Maryfield are now able to purchase gravel from the RM.

2023 DUST CONTROL:

The dust control program for 2023 will be underway shortly. If you are wanting dust control on your frontage, you MUST call the office at 306-646-2033 for instructions and sign a new waiver form. Dust control is scheduled to be put on mid June.

BEAVER BOUNTY:

The RM will NOW be paying \$50 per tail for adult nuisance beavers hunted/trapped within our municipal boundaries. SARM is once again administering a rebate program based on 50:50 cost-share to all RM's to control the beaver population in their respective jurisdictions therefore, IF you have a valid Hunter/Trappers License when you trap the beaver – the RM will then pay you \$65.00 per tail once you have provided the RM office with a copy of said license.

INVASIVE PLANT CONTROL PROGRAM:

In 2023-24, SARM will administer a 50:50 cost-share rebate program to provide financial assistance to rural municipalities and through RMs, other stakeholders with costs to undertake and coordinate the control of Prohibited Weeds as well as specific Noxious Weeds that are persistent and problematic invasive plants.

The Sustainable CAP Invasive Plant Control Program is designed to achieve maximum results and accountability while focusing on early detection and rapid response (EDRR) as the first line of defense to identify, assess, and respond to invasive plant species. Program guidelines, forms and resources will be available soon.
