DID YOU KNOW... "Rail is the most efficient way to transport goods when it comes to the amount of energy required per ton of cargo? If you look at a convoy of trucks rolling down the highway, each unit has its own engine and the load is supported by eighteen wheels mounted on soft rubber tires made from fossil fuels and likely to wear out within a year. The soft tires present a lot of rolling resistance with the asphalt highway, also made from fossil fuels, that must be constantly repaired and resurfaced. A train can pull more than a hundred cars with two or three engines that use steel wheels running on steel rails with very little rolling resistance. Trains are up to six times more fuel efficient per ton of load than trucks and emit a similar amount less carbon.

Cars emit roughly 192 grams of carbon per passenger kilometre while diesel passenger trains emit 41 grams and an electrified train only 4 grams." Excerpt from Bob McDonald's book The Future is Now.




SASK LOTTERIES **COMMUNITY GRANT**

Each year funding is available through Saskatchewan Lotteries. The funding amount is based on a per capita amount, for the populations of the Village of Maryfield, the Village of Fairlight, the RM of Maryfield and the RM of Walpole. The program is designed to provide funding for sport, culture and recreation programs and is administered through the Maryfield Recreation Board.

The Recreation Board then disperses the money to local groups and clubs (some via kitchen convening). A followup report must be prepared for the Saskatchewan Lotteries Community Grant. The follow-up report includes receipts for eligible expenditures.

Organizations that wish to receive grant money can contact Pauline Lincoln, Maryfield Rec. Board treasurer, for information on allowable expenses. Projects and related expenses must have occurred between April 1, 2022 and March 31, 2023.

Prisoner of Tehran, based on the book of the same name, is a unique collaboration between Iranian born writer/speaker Marina Nemat and MOTUS O. This unique performance piece is a synthesis of theatre, video and storytelling that swims in a landscape of movement brushing the themes of oppression, persecution, survival and most of all HOPE. After the Islamic Revolution of 1979, Marina was arrested at the age of sixteen and spent more than two years in Evin, a political prison in Tehran, where she was tortured and came very close to execution. She came to Canada in 1991 and has called it home ever since. Marina's book Prisoner of Tehran has been published in 28 other countries and is an international bestseller. After each show a Question-and-Answer period will take place. Prisoner of Tehran has toured much of Canada including performances to over 10,000 high school students.

Thank-you to Curling Canada for your funding - Maryfield

The Maryfield Curling In-School Program has wound up for its second year. At the request of the school, the second year of the program was subdivided into two, with four sessions in 2022-23 and 2023-24. Twenty-seven students from grades 3, 4 & 5 participated in a 2-hour session in the morning and twenty-two students from grades 6 & 7 participated in a 2-hour session in the afternoon on four school days - January 12 & 30, February 2 and 16. While the majority of students were from Maryfield School, several home-schooled students took advantage of the learning opportunity as well.

The sessions focused on curling delivery – slide basics, line of delivery, broom placement, weight control and sweeping techniques. A short off-ice session each day offered the opportunity for a snack as well as discussions on curling terminology, scoring and strategy. The last day of the program, students put their skills to the test in a 2-end game following their snack break. Great fun was had by all.

Funding for this program is through the "For the Love of Curling" Youth Program, a Curling Canada grant. Curling Canada allowed the second year of the grant to be split into two 4-session years instead of one 8-session year as in 2021-22. As a result in the 2023-24 school year, students will again have access to the curling ice and knowledgeable instructors who can help them learn the game of curling and develop the skills for a game that can be enjoyed for a lifetime – one of Canada's top sports.

Instructors for the program include lead instructor, Barb Swallow, co-ordinator of the program, Janet Lemon and local curler, Randy O'Greysik. This

year, two special guest instructors shared their expertise with the young curlers, local Kim Eklund who has had considerable success in juniors and ladies as well as Rachel Erickson. Rachel has also had great success at the junior and ladies' level; most notably,





Rachel was the alternate for the Mackenzie Zacharias team that won the 2020 World Junior Curling Championship. Currently Rachel throws lead for the Chelsea Carey rink out of Manitoba.

The "For the Love of Curling" Youth Program sponsored by Curling Canada has given the students of Maryfield School the unique chance to learn how to curl as a part of their physical education program.

Organizers of the program, Janet Lemon and Barb Swallow, would like to thank the staff at Maryfield School for adjusting their daily schedules to give the students a 2-hour window on each of the 4
