
Growing Maryfield had a wonderful season thanks to the support of our community. We wanted to thank all the businesses and committees who contributed to our self watering planters.

What you'll need

- · oil/butter/cooking spray for your pot
- 1 chopped onion, chopped (or onion flakes)
- 3 large carrots, diced (frozen/canned/fresh)
- 4 stalks of celery, chopped
- salt and pepper
- 3 cloves of garlic, chopped (or garlic powder)
- 8 cups of broth (or water and broth powder)
- One bag of egg noodles or your favorite noodle!

- Simmer the onions, celery and carrots, salt and pepper in the oil over medium heat until soft.
- · Add the garlic and simmer for about one minute, add the broth and bring to a boil.




CONTROL BURN NUMBER


