FEBRUARY IS HEART HEALTH MONTH!

Did you know... 62% of strokes and 49% of cardiovascular disease are associated with poorly controlled blood pressure?

Have you been told you have high blood pressure? What can you do to help reduce it?

- Maintain a healthy body weight
- Have a diet high in fruits, vegetables, low-fat dairy, low saturated and total fats
- Limit sodium intake to about 1 tsp of salt per day (about 2300mg)
- Have at least 30 minutes of activity per day, most days
- Limit alcohol intake to a maximum of 2/day for men, 1/day for women
- Take your medication every day, as prescribed
- Return to your care provider for regular follow-up



TAX PAYMENTS:

For those of you who have outstanding taxes and/or custom work to be paid for - please drop by the office to clear these accounts before the end of the year. All outstanding accounts will be charged an interest rate at 2% per month. Outstanding custom work will be added to your taxes if not paid for prior to December 31, 2024.

PRIVATE LANES:

Just a reminder of the Municipal Policy regarding the grading/ploughing of private lanes. Ratepayers are allotted two free grades on their lanes, once in the spring and once in the fall ONLY if requested by the ratepayer. Any more than the 2 specified times and custom work rates will apply. A waiver must be signed and held on file at the RM office prior to municipal equipment entering onto private property.

COYOTE BOUNTY:

The R.M. is offering a coyote bounty for 2025. Coyote set which consist of four paws per bag can be dropped off at the R.M.'s shop to be inspected. A form will need to be filled out and returned to the R.M.'s office. Each set is \$30.00 with a limit of 30 sets per hunter. The program is for residence with in the R.M. of Maryfield only. Council has the right to terminate the program without notice.

Did you know? Spirit of Christmas Food Hampers takes donations all year round. Donations can be made to the Maryfield Primary Health Clinic. Program is anonymous. If you need anything please don't hesitate to phone the clinic.


