





Fair Exhibit Hint: Cut Flowers

When showing your work at any exhibition/fair, the entire appearance of the entry is important. You may have an excellent entry, the best thing you've ever done, but if the label is incorrect (wrong class or entry number or incomplete) or if you haven't taken care to print neatly on the tag, the judge may choose another entry for a prize. This may happen especially if the judge cannot decide between two entries of equal excellence. The tag should be attached firmly to the object being shown; it should also be attached as neatly as possible. For instance, with photographs, line up the tag with the edges of the photo if you can. For quilted items, the tag is usually pinned on. Items shown in jars often have the tag attached with string or ribbon. Sometimes, no matter how you attach it, the tag will be with the item being shown in whatever way it decides to be!

History of the Maryfield Library:

1919: Village library (associated with the provincial circulating library) opened November 15 in the Village office

1967: Centennial project - Southeast Regional Library branch to be established in the municipal building erected jointly by the RM of Maryfield and the Village

1968: Village of Maryfield joined the Southeast Regional Library; Robert Cairns - trustee

1969: January 14 Library opened. RM of Maryfield joined; Inez Enion - trustee; Ruby Graham - librarian

1970: Walpole joined; Mrs. Arthur Cameron - trustee

1977: Fairlight joined; George Duncan - trustee A bookmobile went to Fairlight once a month.

(excerpts taken from **Across Border and Valley Volume I** (Mayfield history book))

2010: Saskatchewan Interlibrary Loan System (SILS) established. This system put all Saskatchewan public libraries on the same electronic system. This is what allows library members to go to any library in Saskatchewan to borrow books or any other library materials and to return such items to any library in Saskatchewan.

In Saskatchewan, library membership is free and all activities hosted by the libraries are free. From January to June this year, Maryfield Library has 45 new borrowers!

FIRE SAFETY DEVICE PROJECT WRAP UP



Saturday, June 14th, the fire department hosted an open house and BBQ, the final event of three, partnered with the Maryfield District Lions. This Fire Safety Device Project saw three separate events, a brunch at the Maryfield Rink in February, a delicious pulled pork lunch at the Auditorium in March and this open house BBQ at the fire station. All events were free of charge but donations were welcome! The intent of the project was to raise awareness of the importance of fire safety equipment in our homes and to raise some funds to help offset the purchase of fire safety equipment in local homes where it was needed. Congratulations Maryfield! A total of \$4286 was collected over the course of the project, \$2710 from donations at the first 2 events and the remainder from the sale of safety equipment. \$2286 was used to offset the cost of household equipment purchased through this project and the remaining funds, \$2000, were presented to the fire department on the 14th by Maryfield Lion treasurer, Gilbert Penner.



At 73 years of age I am really not that interested anymore in what I have done and even what I do or plan to do... I am more interested in just "being". How have I become more peaceful, more joyful, more loving? By extension, how has Janet Lemon become more peaceful, more joyful, more loving? KEEP INFORMED ABOUT ROAD BANS AND CLOSURES, FIRE BANS ETC.

To keep informed with all things RM related you can register using the following QR code or call the office and someone will be happy to help you. **Be advised that Website, Facebook and H2Notify will be the only communication about road bans, etc.**



CONTROL BURN:

If you are going to be burning, **PLEASE CALL THE CONTROL BURN** number **1-866-404-4911**. In the event there is a Fire Ban on you will not be given permission for a control burn therefore if the fire department is dispatched you **WILL** be charged.

POLICY REMINDERS:

ROAD BYLAW: The Bylaw stipulates that either written or verbal approval must be obtained from the Council prior to any work being done in a municipal road allowance. If damage is done to a road allowance and council determines that it creates an emergent danger to the public – the Municipality will repair the damage and may add any costs incurred in eliminating the emergency to the tax roll in respect of which the person causing the emergency is the assessed person.

DEVELOPMENT PERMITS: Please remember if you are putting up any structures on your property you are required to have a development permit. If you are thinking of putting up a structure, bins or sheds please come to the office and fill out the paper work.

BUILDING BYLAW: The new Building Bylaw is now in effect - Building standards apply to any residential occupancy on Agricultural land. If you are building or renovating a new dwelling, a basement development, a deck, or a garage to serve as an accessory to the dwelling, a building permit is required for these projects. All codes and rules are set and followed by Provincial Guidelines and Municode.

NOXIOUS WEEDS

The weed inspector will be out to do a check of the municipality for noxious weeds in the near future. Weeds found in past years have been Leafy Spurge, Scentless Camomile, Common Tansy, as well as some Wild Parsnip. If you happen to find a patch, please don't hesitate to give the office a call with the land location and we will send the inspector out to have a look at it!

MOWING OF DITCHES

It is the intent of the R.M. of Maryfield to start the 2025 mowing program towards the end of June this year, weather dependent. If you are planning on cutting the ditches for the purpose of haying them, it would be greatly appreciated if you could advise us of the locations that you will be cutting. ***Please be aware*** that when we are mowing - the municipality will be mowing a minimum of 15 feet from the road – if you are farming the ditches – your crop will be cut down.

FARM EQUIPMENT IN DITCHES

The R.M. of Maryfield is asking everyone to please use approaches to enter fields. If you have accidentally put ruts in the ditches, please clean them up as soon as possible as we will be beginning our mowing program. With increased ruts comes increase costs of repairs and more down time thus the ditches will not get mowed. Should the RM have to clean up ruts from people not using the approaches we will be charging for the cost of cleanup.

ELECTRIC FENCE

Electric fences are being left and not cleaned up and causing more mower down time. Please be advised if you have electric fence and it is in the ditch bottoms you are responsible for cleaning it up. Should our mower or equipment become entangled in the fence you will be billed for the machine time, any repairs necessary and personnel time it takes to clean it out of the equipment.

BEAVER BOUNTY:

The R.M.'s beaver bounty is \$50 per tail for adult nuisance beavers hunted/trapped within our municipal boundaries. SARM is once again administering a rebate program based on 50:50 cost-share to all RM's to control the beaver population in their respective jurisdictions therefore, IF you have a valid Hunter/Trappers License when you trap the beaver – the RM will then pay you \$65.00 per tail once you have provided the RM office with a copy of said license.

HAY TENDER 2025

Tenders are now being accepted for the 2025 haying season for SE PT 28-09-31 W1, 30 acres. Tender bid is per acre and for one year. Bales need to be removed by October 31st, 2025. Bidders are responsible for familiarizing themselves with the land before bidding. Tenders must be received by the Office of the R.M. of

Maryfield by 4 pm on July 9th, 2025. Tenders can be mailed to Box 70, Maryfield, SK S0G 3K0 or delivered to 115 Main Street, Maryfield, SK. Council reserves the right to reject any and all tenders.

GARBAGE/RECYCLE BINS

Loraas is permitted to accept only solid, non-hazardous waste materials including general household garbage, food, yard and garden waster, etc. They DO NOT accept any regulated waste such as: hazardous waste, medical waste, pressure-filled containers, paint, used oil or containers, or electronics. Please be diligent in using the Garbage and Recycle bins properly. We do not want to lose this service by having the bins removed from the municipality. ALSO, ensure the lids are closed every time - so that garbage is not blowing around the area.


