

Each year funding is available through Saskatchewan Lotteries. The funding amount is based on per capita amount, for the populations of the Village of Maryfield, the Village of Fairlight, the RM of Maryfield and the RM of Walpole. The program is designed to provide funding for sport, culture and recreation programs and is administered through the Maryfield Recreation Board.

The Recreation Board then dispenses the money to the local groups and clubs (some via kitchen convening). A follow up report must be prepared for the Saskatchewan Lotteries Community Grant. The follow up report includes receipts for eligible expenditures.

Organizations that wish to receive grant money can contact Pauline Lincoln, Maryfield Rec Board Treasurer, for info on allowable expenses. Projects and related expenses must have occurred between April 1, 2024 and March 31, 2025

Fair Exhibit Hint: Cut Flowers

Consider balance, proportion and scale. Avoid clashing colours. Design, colour and condition of the flowers need to be considered. Table arrangements should not be taller than 14 inches. Scale is even more important in miniature arrangements. The flowers and the container should both be tiny. If you use tape or foam, it should not be visible; cover it with foliage or flowers. Keep in mind that, if you arrange the cut flowers the night before the fair,

the flowers will open more overnight, so try to use ones that are not fully open at that time. Originality, as with any fair entry, can make the difference between a good and an excellent entry.



Our Steak Night will be held on Sunday, June 8 @ The Arlington 4:00-7:00. We hope to see you there!!







2025 DUST CONTROL:

The dust control program for 2025 will be underway shortly. If you are wanting dust control on your frontage, you can call the office at 306-646-2033 for instructions and sign a new waiver form. Dust control is scheduled to be put on mid June.

SASK MUNICIPAL HAIL INSURANCE:

1) MUNICIPAL HAIL INSURANCE (SMHI):

- Continuous Hail insurance coverage up to \$400 per acre, premiums are paid as taxes allowing for early payment discounts;
- Crop Report deadline is June 15th –New application deadline is June 30th;
- Annual Crop Reports have now been mailed out – please fill in the acreage and coverage wanted & either file online or return your form to the RM office; and
- If you have questions or would like to purchase additional coverage, please contact the municipal office at 646-2033.

2) ADDITIONAL HAIL INSURANCE (AMHI):

- Annual policy application and deadline to apply is August 1st;
- Provides coverage on crops on rented land or additional coverage on land already insured by SMHI but coverage with SMHI is not required;
- Premiums paid at time of application - cheque, credit card (Visa/MasterCard);
- Indemnities up to \$500.00/acre (conditions may apply).

SASK. MUNICIPAL HAIL - \$1000 SCHOLARSHIPS

SMHI supports the next generation of smart minds through their Municipal hail Insurance Scholarships. 5 scholarships are awarded annually in July to students enrolled in a university or technical institute in the Province of Saskatchewan and are a dependent of a client, an employee or an agent of Municipal Hail.

2025 ASSESSMENT NOTICES

By now you should have received 2025 assessment notices. The province of Saskatchewan has reassessed all properties. The R.M.'s tax roll will be open for inspection until June 9th, 2025. If you have any questions please call or stop in the office, we will be happy to assist you.

2025 GRAVEL PROGRAM:

The 2025 road gravelling season will start soon! If you are planning on getting gravel in your yard or on lane, please call the RM Office at 306-646-2033 so that we can co-ordinate with the Gravel Haulers to ensure that you will be getting the requested gravel in an orderly fashion. The current cost for crushed gravel is \$15.00 per cubic yard plus the cost of hauling the gravel. Please note the RM has changed their policy so that Ratepayers of the Village of Fairlight and the Village of Maryfield are now able to purchase gravel from the RM.

NOXIOUS WEEDS

The weed inspector will be out to do a check of the municipality for noxious weeds in the near future. Weeds found in past years have been Leafy Spurge, Scentless Camomile, Common Tansy, as well as some Wild Parsnip. If you happen to find a patch, please don't hesitate to give the office a call with the land location and we will send the inspector out to have a look at it!

MOWING OF DITCHES

It is the intent of the R.M. of Maryfield to start the 2025 mowing program, weather dependent. If you are planning on cutting the ditches for the purpose of haying them, it would be greatly appreciated if you could advise us of the locations that you will be cutting. ***Please be aware*** that when we are mowing - the municipality will be mowing a minimum of 15 feet from the road – if you are farming the ditches – your crop will be cut down.

FARM EQUIPMENT IN DITCHES

The R.M. of Maryfield is asking everyone to please use approaches to enter fields. If you have accidentally put ruts in the ditches, please clean them up as soon as possible as we will be beginning our mowing program. With increased ruts comes increase costs of repairs and more down time thus the ditches will not get mowed. Should the RM have to clean up ruts from people not using the approaches we will be charging for the cost of cleanup.

ELECTRIC FENCE

Electric fences are being left and not cleaned up and causing more mower down time. Please be advised if you have electric fence and it is in the ditch bottoms you are responsible for cleaning it up. Should our mower or equipment become entangled in the fence you will be billed for the machine time, any repairs

necessary and personnel time it takes to clean it out of the equipment.

GARBAGE/RECYCLE BINS

Loraas is permitted to accept only solid, non-hazardous waste materials including general household garbage, food, yard and garden waster, etc. They DO NOT accept any regulated waste such as: hazardous waste, medical waste, pressure-filled containers, paint, used oil or containers, or electronics. Please be diligent in using the Garbage and Recycle bins properly. We do not want to lose this service by having the bins removed from the municipality. ALSO, ensure the lids are closed every time - so that garbage is not blowing around the area.

BEAVER BOUNTY:

The R.M.'s beaver bounty is \$50 per tail for adult nuisance beavers hunted/trapped within our municipal boundaries. SARM is once again administering a rebate program based on 50:50 cost-share to all RM's to control the beaver population in their respective jurisdictions therefore, IF you have a valid Hunter/Trappers License when you trap the beaver – the RM will then pay you \$65.00 per tail once you have provided the RM office with a copy of said license.

HAY TENDER 2025

Tenders are now being accepted for the 2025 haying season for SE PT 28-09-31 W1, 30 acres. Tender bid is per acre and for one year. Bales need to be removed by October 31st, 2025. Bidders are responsible for familiarizing themselves with the land before bidding. Tenders must be received by the Office of the R.M. of Maryfield by 4 pm on June 11th, 2025. Tenders can be mailed to Box 70, Maryfield, SK S0G 3K0 or delivered to 115 Main Street, Maryfield, SK. Council reserves the right to reject any and all tenders.

CONTROL BURN:

If you are going to be burning, **PLEASE CALL THE CONTROL BURN** number **1-866-404-4911**. In the event there is a Fire Ban on you will not be given permission for a control burn therefore if the fore department is dispatched you **WILL** be charged.



Policy/Bylaw Reminders

Please do not blow grass clippings and leaves on the street, as this plugs the drains.

Bylaw 2002 'Animal Control Bylaw'

Part 2 of the Bylaw

- **Sec 7a)** no dog or cat shall defecate on any public or private property.
- **Sec 7b)** if the owner fails to remove such defecation immediately, the owner will be in violation of this bylaw.
- **Sec 8** no owner shall permit their dog or cat to damage public or private property
- **Sec 9** every owner of a dog or cat shall provide them with a collar

Part 3 of the Bylaw

- **Sec 18** no person shall possess or harbour more than four (4) dogs or four (4) cats or a combination of both.
- **Sec 19** no person shall tease, entice, bait, or throw objects at a dog or cat within its owner's property.
- **Sec 24** no owner of a dog or cat shall permit them to become a nuisance by barking, howling or emitting other animal sounds continuously for a period exceeding 10 minutes.

The minimum fee for violating this bylaw is \$50.00.

Bylaw 1802 'Traffic Bylaw'

Part 4 of the Bylaw

- **Sec c ii)** no person shall deface damage, destroy or remove any sign.
- **Sec f ii)** no person shall park a vehicle in any lane or street to obstruct the entrance to any lane or driveway.
- **Sec f iii)** every person parking upon Main Street between Railway Avenue and Pipestone Avenue shall angle park.
- **Sec f vii)** no person shall park a vehicle on any street at one place for any period of time exceeding forty-eight (48) consecutive hours.

Part 5 of the Bylaw

- **Sec a)** The 'Heavy Truck Route' shall be designated as the 600 Grid, to Railway Avenue and then to the closest route to its destination.

The minimum fee for violating this bylaw is \$100.00.

Bylaw 12/09 & 07/22 'Nuisance Abatement Bylaw'

Bylaw 12/09

- **Sec 7** no person shall allow an unoccupied building to become damaged or deteriorate such that it is an imminent danger to public safety.
- **Sec 8** no owner or occupant shall allow for their land to be overgrown with grass or weeds. (Overgrown meaning in excess of 0.20 meters in height)
- **Sec 11** no person shall allow any land or buildings to become untidy or unsightly.
- **Sec 12** no person shall allow any junked vehicle to be kept on any land owned by that person. (Junked vehicle meaning any automobile, tractor, truck, trailer or other vehicle that has no valid license plates or is rusted, wrecked, dismantled or in abandoned condition.
- **Sec 15** any building materials, lumber, scrap metal, boxes or similar items stored in a yard shall be neatly stacked in piles and elevated off of the ground.

Bylaw 07/22

- **Sec 2** states that untidy and unsightly properties will receive one warning. Second warning includes a \$25 fine, third warning includes a \$50 fine, fourth warning includes a \$75 fine including a notice that the Village maintenance men will come clean and charge \$100 per hour for their time.


