Fair Exhibit Hints:

What to put on the tag - The Class, Section, Exhibitor Number, Name & Address are standard. For the Article, I put the name of the item as listed in the Fairbook. If something is listed as 'any other variety' (such as relish) it is important to put in the variety. With a hanging basket, name the variety of the plant or plants. Titles for snapshots, I now think, are a good idea if the picture warrants it. Having an interesting title could make the difference if there is a tie between 2 items. For instance, in 2023, I used pictures of 3 different purple flowers and I labeled it 'Purple Passion'. If you have a title for other projects such as a quilt or wall hanging or a craft article, put it on the tag. It doesn't hurt & it may help.






