JESS MOSKALUKE - Life for Me Tour

Internationally celebrated artist Jess Moskaluke continues to break barriers in country music with her powerful voice, pop-infused hooks, and sonic versatility. Her new single, "Life For Me," offers a first glimpse into her forthcoming new music—elevated, personal, joyful, and full of spirited authenticity—marking an exciting new chapter in her career. The first Canadian female country artist since Shania Twain to achieve Canadian Platinum single status with the hit "Cheap Wine and Cigarettes," Moskaluke celebrated the 10th anniversary of its release last year with newly reimagined mixes of the fan-favourite track. She has since gone on to earn Canadian Gold certifications for "Take Me Home," "Kiss Me Quiet," "Knock Off," and her first NUMBER ONE, "Country Girls." NEWS FROM MARYFIELD SCHOOL

Welcome to one of my favourite times of the year. This is one of those rare moments where I am completely caught up on my marking, and I am so excited to have the fresh start that comes with the first days of school. You can feel the excitement in our building and we are ready for everything that this year has to offer. Our staff this year is made up of a great group of dedicated educators. We have had no changes to our teaching staff from last year, and this familiarity helps us to more readily meet the needs of our students. We have welcomed a few new students and families to our building over the summer, bringing our student enrolment to right around 100 students from K-12.

While some aspects of the school year start out a bit slow, there are a few things that parents should be watching for in the first few weeks. Golf and cross country practices will be starting almost immediately after school begins. Students should be looking to make contact with those coaches in the first few days of the school year. I also expect that volleyball practices will be firing up by the middle of September, so we will be looking to see what level of interest there is for those teams as we start out the school year.

One last thing that I would like to note is that I will be teaching our Grade 10-12 Practical and Applied Arts (PAA) course this year. The class is scheduled to take place over a full morning one day per 6 day cycle. Additionally, if you have some skills or talents that you would like to share with any of our grade 6-12 PAA classes and can spare some time, we are always open to having parents or community volunteers join us for a morning or

two as their schedule permits! Ms. Smid in particular is looking for volunteers to assist with her grade 8/9 PAA sewing unit this year.

Be advised that Website, Facebook and H2Notify will be the only communication about road bans, etc.



PAYMENT OF TAXES:

Please remember you can still get a 6% discount on your taxes up to and including August 31st, 5% discount on your taxes if paid on or before September 30th, 4% until October 31st, and 2% until November 30th. **Taxes can be paid in any amounts any time throughout the year.** You do NOT have to wait and make one lump sum payment. **Please be sure all mailed cheques will be received in the office by the end of the month you intend them to be paid in.**

HIGHWAY CLOSURE/DETOUR:

The Department of Highways will be closing Highway 8th north of Fairlight to replace a bridge with a culvert.

Detour -heading South intersection of Highway 8 and 48, go east on Highway 4; turn south on Range Rd 1305 turn west onto Twp Rd 95 to Highway 8. The opposite appl when heading North. Work is to start end of August beginning of September.



CONTROL BURN:

If you are going to be burning, **PLEASE CALL THE CONTROL BURN number 1-866-404-4911.** In the event there is a Fire Ban on you will not be given permission for a control burn therefore if the fire department is dispatched you **WILL** be charged.

NOXIOUS WEEDS

The weed inspector will be out to do a check of the municipality for noxious weeds in the near future. Weeds found in past years have been Leafy Spurge, Scentless Camomile, Common Tansy, as well as some Wild Parsnip. If you happen to find a patch, please don't hesitate to give the office a call with the land location and we will send the inspector out to have a look at it!

MOWING OF DITCHES

Please be aware that when the R.M. is mowing - the municipality will be mowing a minimum of 15 feet from the road - if you are farming the ditches - your crop will be cut down.

BEAVER BOUNTY:

The R.M.'s beaver bounty is \$50 per tail for adult nuisance beavers hunted/trapped within our municipal boundaries. SARM is once again administering a rebate program based on 50:50 cost-share to all RM's to control the beaver population in their respective jurisdictions therefore, IF you have a valid Hunter/Trappers License when you trap the beaver - the RM will then pay you \$65.00 per tail once you have provided the RM office with a copy of said license.

GARBAGE/RECYCLE BINS

Loraas is permitted to accept only solid, non-hazardous waste materials including general household garbage, food, yard and garden waster, etc. They DO NOT accept any regulated waste such as: hazardous waste, medical waste, pressure-filled containers, paint, used oil or containers, or electronics. Please be diligent in using the Garbage and Recycle bins properly. We do not want to lose this service by having the bins removed from the municipality. ALSO, ensure the lids are closed every time - so that garbage is not blowing around the area.

The RM office will be open on the following days/hours unless a notice is posted on the front door: Monday to Friday from 8:00 am - Noon, 1:00 pm - 4:00 pm.


