Maryfield Lions Annual Minispiel

Maryfield Lions hosted their annual minispiel on March 4. Twenty teams competed in the point system event with all teams playing three 6-end games. The minispiel has been an annual event for more than 50 years. The event started with frozen javex jugs as rocks and then the Lions purchased small plastic curling rocks that are still in use to this day. Students from Maryfield, Kola and Boundary Lane Hutterite Colony participated. The 9 teams who scored the most points during their 3 games – 10 points per win, 5 points for a tie and 1 point per end scored – received a trophy in a pick-a-trophy format. The trophies are repurposed. Donors drop off their unwanted trophies and the Lions purchase new name plates displaying the current year. Participants learn about the game of curling. Between games, they can go skating or visit with friends and family in the waiting room or upstairs lounge. Thanks to the Maryfield Lions who were able to help out with the event; thanks to all of the school staff members who helped supervise games on the curling ice, the lounge and the skating ice.

A huge thank you to the school staff who organized the curling event for their students. It was a busy day and fun was had by all!
