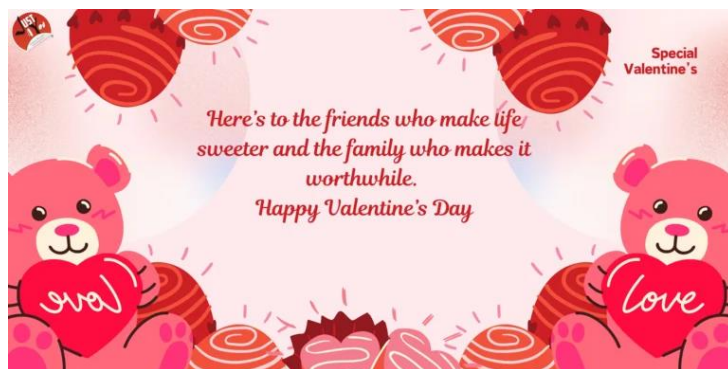

FEBRUARY IS HEART HEALTH MONTH!

Did you know... 62% of strokes and 49% of cardiovascular disease are associated with poorly controlled blood pressure?

Have you been told you have high blood pressure? What can you do to help reduce it?

- Maintain a healthy body weight
- Have a diet high in fruits, vegetables, low-fat dairy, low saturated and total fats
- Limit sodium intake to about 1 tsp of salt per day (about 2300mg)
- Have at least 30 minutes of activity per day, most days
- Limit alcohol intake to a maximum of 2/day for men, 1/day for women
- Take your medication every day, as prescribed
- Return to your care provider for regular follow-up

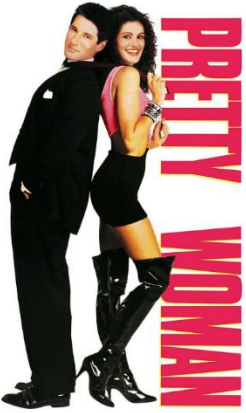

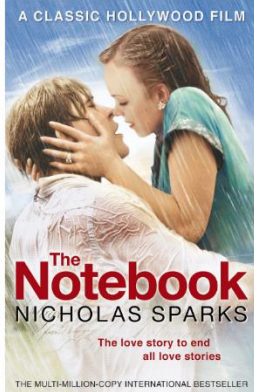

Minute Summary for December 2025

Council approved the following business:

- Bylaw 2505, "A Bylaw to Provide Regulating, Prohibiting, and Controlling of Animals and Running at Large of Animals" was adopted;
- Ratified the quote for 2 front Kubota tires for a cost of \$682 plus applicable taxes;
- Confirmed through motion that the Village meets the eligibility requirements to receive the Municipal Revenue Sharing grant;
- Authorized the Administrator to process and sign all cheques pertaining to 2025;
- Authorized the Administrator to apply outstanding utility arrears to the owner's tax card;
- Authorized the Administrator to write off the 2025 taxes for the properties taken back through tax enforcement through the year;
- Approved additional paths for the installation of fibre optic cable; and
- Approved council remuneration for 2025.

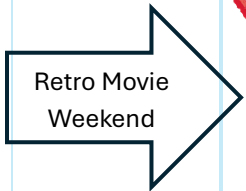

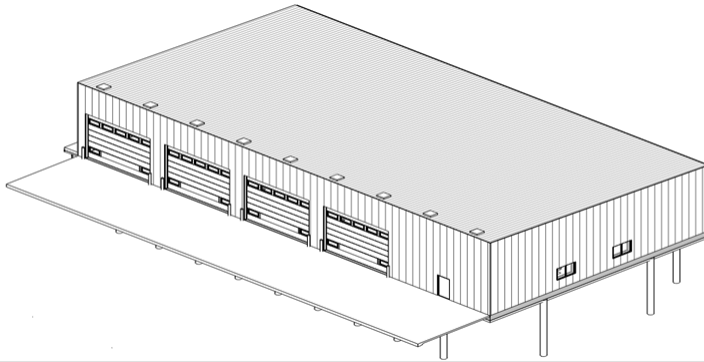

SARM is once again administering a rebate program based on 50:50 cost-share to all RM's to control the beaver population in their respective jurisdictions therefore, IF you have a valid Hunter/Trappers License when you trap the beaver – the RM will then pay you \$65.00 per tail once you have provided the RM office with a copy of said license.

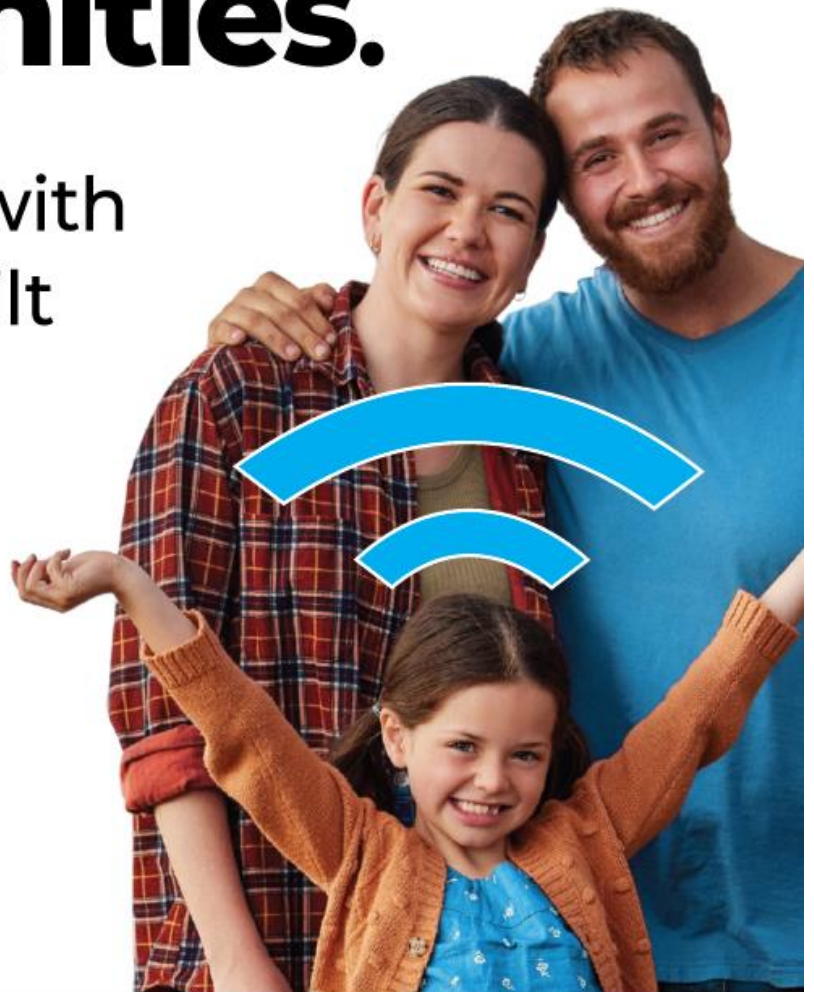

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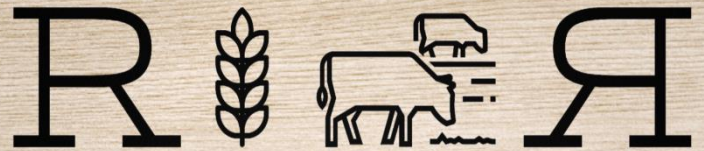
