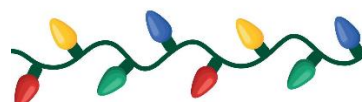

MAINTENANCE CONTRACTOR

This is a contract position responsible for the maintenance of the buildings and grounds of the housing authority units in Maryfield. The maintenance contractor receives general direction from the manager. This position is to commence in April of 2026, an earlier start may occur if all parties agree to an earlier date.

The Maryfield Housing Authority manages a portfolio consisting of 14 Senior Housing units.

The successful contractor is to provide or subcontract the following services:

- Routine janitorial services.
- Routine grounds maintenance, including snow removal and lawn care.
- Minor maintenance of common areas and rental units including repairs and/or replacements.
- Accessibility to Housing Authority tenants for emergency repairs.
- Maintenance of inventories and equipment.
- Regular building, unit and vacant unit inspections.
- Boiler monitoring and maintenance.

The contractor must have excellent communication skills and be able to provide services cooperatively to individuals and groups of varying backgrounds. A high degree of discretion and confidentiality is required. A basic working knowledge of carpentry, plumbing, heating, electrical and general property maintenance practices as well as the ability to perform manual labor and lifting tasks is required. Contractor to provide all tools and equipment including personal vehicle and cell phone.

The preference is for a single contractor to perform all required services however, the Maryfield Housing Authority reserves the right to consider separate applications for janitorial, grounds or maintenance services or any combination.

The preferred candidate will be required to complete a Criminal Record Check including a vulnerable sector check prior to the offer of and appointment to a position.

Minute Summary for November 2025

Council approved the following business:

- Bylaw 2505, “A Bylaw to Provide Regulating, Prohibiting, and Controlling of Animals and Running at Large of Animals” was introduced and read for the first time;
- Acknowledged and filed their completed annual public disclosure statements;
- Approved and signed the 2025 Engagement and Planning Letters for Dudley and Company LLP to complete the 2025 fiscal year-end audit;
- Awarded the tender for 202 Main Street for \$10 to be the future home of the Maryfield Lighthouse and approved this property to be tax exempt as a non-profit property;
- Approved a land bid of \$500 for 116 Lynch Street;
- Authorized the administrator to sign the Enbridge Pipeline Integrity Dig Program for 2026;
- Approved to pay the Maryfield Library an annual grant of \$400 to assist with the utility expenses;
- Approved the additional RFNow paths;
- Approved the holiday closure hours for the office.

Animal Bylaw Highlights

Bylaw 2505 A Bylaw to Provide Regulating, Prohibiting, and Controlling of Animals and Running at Large was passed at the December 18, 2025 council meeting.



Number of Pets Allowed

- A maximum of 4 animals total per property:
 - Dogs and/or cats combined
 - Animals must be over 3 months of age
- Exceptions apply for:
 - Veterinary clinics, kennels, grooming facilities
 - Public pounds
 - Registered breeders
 - Incorporated shelters or rescues
- Exceeding the limit will result in a **fine of \$50 per animal exceeding the limit.**



Running at Large

- Dogs and cats are not allowed to run at large anywhere in the Village.
- Owners are responsible if their animal is found at large.
- Residents may file a **written complaint** with the Bylaw Officer.
- Bylaw of Peace Officers may:
 - Seize and impound dogs or cats running at large.
 - Enter land surrounding buildings to capture animals.
- Cat traps may be issued with an approved Cat Trap Permit.
- Any person may safely restrain an animal at large and deliver it to the Pound Keeper.
- Interfering with an officer during seizure is prohibited.
- If your animal is found running at large this will result in a **fine of \$100.**



Other Animals

- **No poultry, livestock, birds, pigeons, or bees** are not allowed in the Village, except on agriculture assessed property.
- Exotic or prohibited animals listed in **Schedule “C”** are not allowed.



Dangerous Dogs

- Complaints regarding dangerous dogs are handled under **The Municipalities Act.**
- A judge may declare a dog **dangerous** and impose restrictions or removal.



Pet Waste (Defecation)

- Owners must:
 - Prevent waste from accumulating on their property
 - Clean up waste immediately on **public or private property.**
 - Dispose of waste in a sanitary manner.
- Failure to clean up waste will result in **finest between \$50 to \$100.**



Nuisance – Dogs

- Dogs must not:
 - Bite, injure, chase or threaten people.
 - Damage property or harm other animals.
- Excessive barking or howling is a nuisance if:
 - Lasts **10 minutes continuously**, or
 - Occurs **1 hour intermittently**
- Nuisance will result in **finest between \$50 to \$100.**



Nuisance – Cats

- Cats must not:
 - Urinate, defecate, or spray on other people's property.
 - Damage property or other animals.
- Nuisance will result in **finest between \$50 to \$100.**



Please do not park
on the side of the road if you
have other parking available.
This causes longer wait
times for snow removal.

For those of you who have outstanding taxes and/or custom work to be paid for - please drop by the office to clear these accounts before the end of the year. All outstanding accounts will be charged an interest rate at 2% per month. Outstanding custom work will be added to your taxes if not paid for prior to December 31, 2024.

Council would like to remind everyone pushing snow to please refrain from piling snow from yards across the grid roads and/or piling along the edge of the grid. These piles get hard and cause a lot of damage and liability issues if they are hit. If you are found to be piling snow along the road you will be sent a bill for the cost of relocating the pile off of municipal right of way.

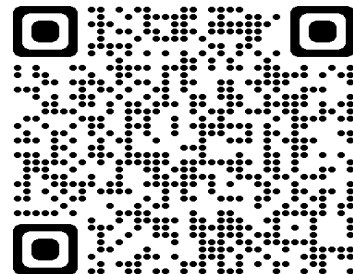
Just a reminder of the Municipal Policy regarding the grading/ploughing of private lanes. Ratepayers are allotted two free grades on their lanes, once in the spring and once in the fall ONLY if requested by the ratepayer. Any more than the 2 specified times and custom work rates will apply. A waiver must be signed and held on file at the RM office prior to municipal equipment entering onto private property.

Please note that Section 293 Exemptions need to be filed with the RM office no later than March 31st in each year. If you have any questions regarding this please contact the RM office for a form and any questions.

Council would like to remind everyone about the

Municipal Policy regarding Road Allowances. Before any work can be done, please contact your Councillor or the Office to bring your request to Council for approval.

The RM has subscribed to H2Notify – a notification system for rate-payers to keep up to date with notices and information. To sign up for the notification system go to our website and click on “H2Notify Registration” or scan the QR code. If you need help call the office 306-646-2033 and someone will help you register.

Maryfield Lighthouse Update

The non-profit thrift store & food share project, at 201 Main Street in Maryfield has been progressing in remarkable ways. It is being developed to support the community through affordable access to goods and the reuse of donated items. The goal being to create a space that benefits the local community while keeping usable items out of the landfill.

A small group of volunteers recently spent an afternoon cleaning and organizing items left behind in the building. The Village of Maryfield and the RM of Maryfield generously supported these efforts by arranging for a construction disposal bin, allowing for the removal of materials that were no longer needed. Electricity has also been restored to the building, marking an important step forward. The building is structurally sound, with current work focused on interior clean up to prepare for the next stages (roof repair, furnace, new ceiling, flooring, etc.).

Community response so far has been very encouraging. Since December 1st, donations totaling over \$18,000 have been received, and 18 local households have reached out to offer hands on support. Fundraising will continue as the project works toward its goal of \$100,000. A demolition day is being planned to strip the building down to its basic elements in preparation for renovations, making it a safe and usable space once again. Those interested in being available to help with this stage of the work are encouraged to send an email to express interest. Community members are invited to share fundraising ideas or pass along information about grants that may be a good fit. Updates will continue to be shared on Facebook for those who would like to follow along as the project progresses.

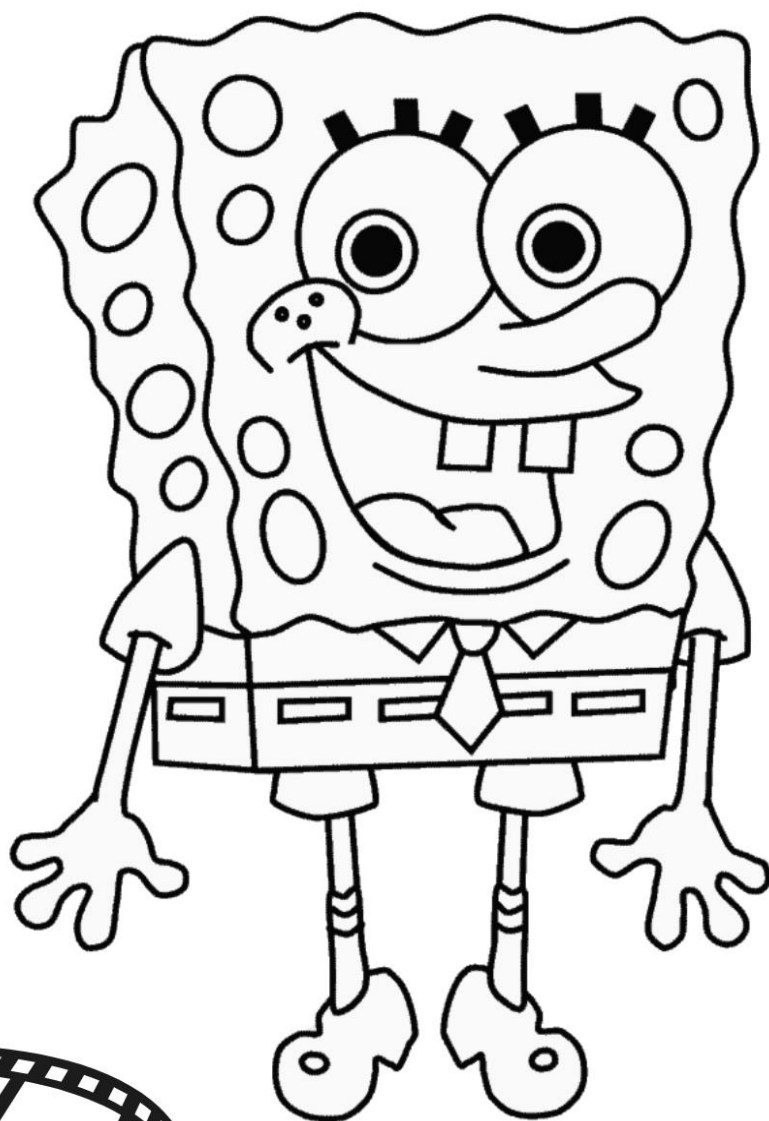

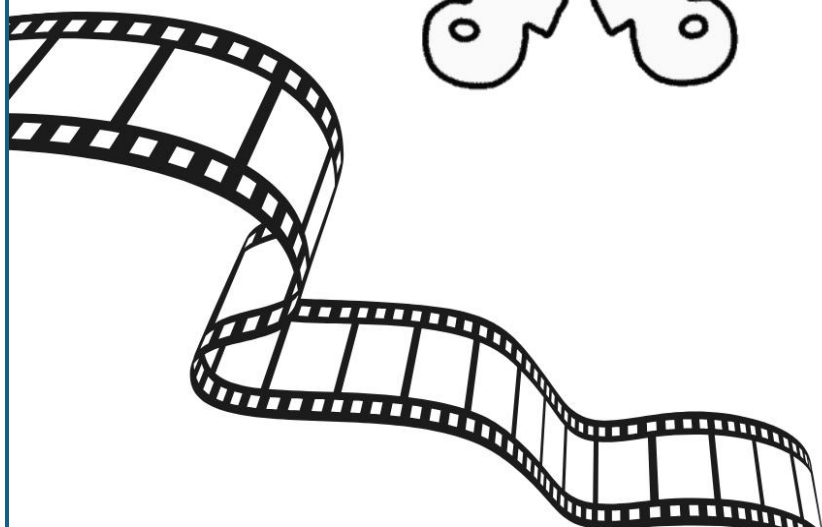
