Age of Revolutions: Progress and Backlash from 1600 to the Present by Fareed Zakaria

The CBC interviewed this author and he was so
interesting and easy to understand that I ordered
his book from the library. His book is fascinating in
a way that high school history could not be, many,
many years ago (for me!), because Donald Trump
had not yet risen to power.

With history unfolding in front of us, this book
explains the rise and fall of many revolutions over
time and why Great Britain, Europe and eventually
United States developed as they have. The
Netherlands actually led the way for innovation,
acceptance of all who came to Holland escaping

from regimes that were persecuting them. You
could be an artist, an innovator, a businessman -
you were welcome to do your own thing. Much of
this was due to the Netherlands not having much
land mass so that they did not have the history of
kingdoms and fiefdoms and, basically slave
labour from the people under their rule. The
Netherlands were a trading nation and ruled the
seas for ages with some of their innovations,
many developed by their immigrants.

That's all I'm telling you. If you read the book, or
skim some of it, it will give you an idea of how we,
in our current age, fit into a slot of history with the
unknown factor of how it will all play out for those
who come after us.

The R.M.'s beaver bounty is \$50 per tail for adult nuisance beavers hunted/trapped within our municipal boundaries. SARM is once again administering a rebate program based on 50:50 cost-share to all RM's to control the beaver population in their respective jurisdictions therefore, IF you have a valid Hunter/Trappers License when you trap the beaver – the RM will then pay you \$65.00 per tail once you have provided the RM office with a copy of said license.

Loraas is permitted to accept only solid, non-hazardous waste materials including general household garbage, food, yard and garden waste, etc. They DO NOT accept any regulated waste such as: hazardous waste, medical waste, pressure-filled containers, paint, used oil or containers, or electronics. 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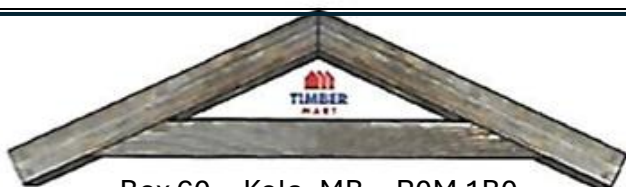
