Each year funding is available through Saskatchewan Lotteries. The funding amount is based on per capita amount, for the populations of the Village of Maryfield, the Village of Fairlight, the RM of Maryfield and the RM of Walpole. The program is designed to provide funding for sport, culture and recreation programs and is administered through the Maryfield Recreation Board.

The Recreation Board then dispenses the money to the local groups and clubs (some via kitchen convening). A follow up report must be prepared for the Saskatchewan Lotteries Community Grant. The follow up report includes receipts for eligible expenditures.

Organizations that wish to receive grant money can contact Pauline Lincoln, Maryfield Rec Board Treasurer, for info on allowable expenses. Projects and related expenses must have occurred between April 1, 2025 and March 31, 2026

Maryfield District Lions Annual Seniors' Luncheon

Approximately 40 seniors enjoyed a delicious roast beef luncheon on Thursday, April 2, 2026 at the Maryfield Harmony Centre. This is an annual tradition, always slated for the Thursday before Good Friday. The Lions prepare a delicious meal - roast beef, mashed potatoes, gravy, turnips, carrots, jellied salads, coleslaw, homemade buns, pickles and yes of course dessert. The luncheon is free for all who attend with the Lions covering all costs associated with the event. Many who attend wish to show their appreciation and so it has become habit to put out a collection bowl. Those who wish can give a donation - all donations are given to a designated charity set by the Maryfield Lions Club. This year's funds will go to the Redvers Activity Centre Wheelchair Accessible Van Project. This project is being led by the Redvers Lions Club \$900 was collected so with the Maryfield District Lions matching the luncheon donation total, the Redvers Activity Centre Wheelchair Accessible Van project will be nearly \$1800 closer to their goal. The success of the luncheon is dependent on the generosity of the Maryfield Lions who donate almost everything needed for the meal. The roast beef is purchased from Horizon Meats in Maryfield and is cooked and sliced by David Hill, a long-time supporter of the Maryfield Club. He and Nora-Lynn also made and donated the gravy.



A huge thank you to everyone who came out to enjoy the meal - your attendance and words of appreciation make the work worthwhile. Following the meal, Lion Rob Hill read a short story. Two volunteers were recruited from the crowd, Dale Thiessen and Audrey Bell Freitag. They were given 4 hats each, one for father, mother, brother and sister.

As the story was told they exchanged the hats as father, mother, brother and sister's names were heard. The story, by the way, was riddled with those names.

As you can imagine, the two were kept very busy donning one hat only to replace it seconds later with a different hat. Audrey started stacking the hats rather than exchanging them, adding to the fun and the laughter.

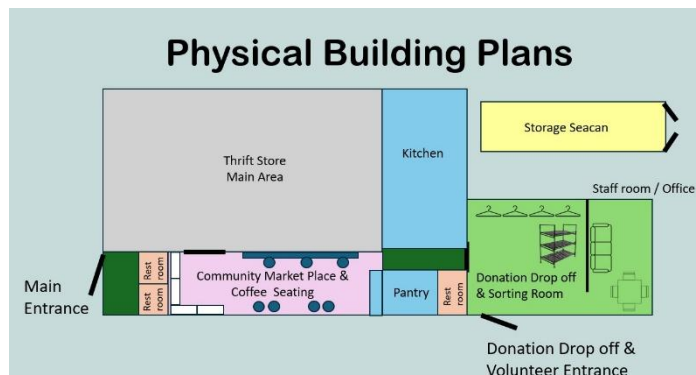
Pork on a Bun Supper & Informational Meeting about

Maryfield Lighthouse

Thrift Store Food Share Project

Saturday, April 18, 2026, Maryfield District Lions hosted a community supper at the Maryfield Harmony Centre. The supper was open to community members who would like to learn about the Maryfield Lighthouse Thrift Store Food Share Project. Supper, catered by the Maryfield Lions, included pulled pork on a bun, potato salad, corn salad, coleslaw, and pickles. Dessert was fruit crisp – apple, rhubarb, rhubarb raspberry, cherry, rhubarb custard – and ice cream. Following supper, the Maryfield Lighthouse committee presented a powerpoint about the thrift store food share project. Melissa Thiessen, Mary Thiessen, Jeff Chambers and Terry Friesen shared details of the project:

- the goals of the project
- the modules of the facility were outlined: thrift store, food share/pantry area, vendor marketplace, coffee area, drop off, office space, and basement storage.



- the status of the renovations
- the purchase of a seacan for storage of articles that have not been purchased and will be donated to another facility i.e. Carmichael's Outreach

- run by volunteers and students (perhaps providing some level of employment for students)
- how funds raised will be used i.e. operational expenses first, educational funding, etc.
- funding: fundraising goal is \$125 000; current donations total \$29,185; additional funding to be secured through individual donations, grant applications, letters of request for donations to companies & organizations, etc.
- assurance that the plan is not to negatively impact local businesses but hopefully bring people to the community who will then buy at local businesses as well
- timeline: as funds allow – optimistic that the thrift store will be operational by the end of the year.
- Officially registered as a non-profit organization with the government

Approximately 60 people attended the event. Supper was free but donations were encouraged. \$1615 was collected – all of which was given to the Lighthouse Project.

The Maryfield Lighthouse Thrift Store Food Share Inc. now has their own bank account. Donations can be made directly to the Lighthouse. However, if donors wish, they can write cheques to the Village of Maryfield in order to get an income tax receipts. Receipts will be issued for donations of \$50 or more.





NEW SHOP BUILD:

The new shop at the R.M. will be starting construction effective April 28, 2026. Please be cautious if you use the garbage bins that are in the RM maintenance yard. Construction will continue throughout the summer months.

EMERGENCY STRYCHNINE PROGRAM:

The R.M. of Maryfield No. 91 is an approved Rm for the emergency Strychnine program. Some details have been provided to the R.M. however it is unknown yet as to how the program will run. Users of the strychnine will be required to complete training before accessing the strychnine. There will also be considerable paperwork involved. Once the R.M. has received further information they will let ratepayers know.

FIRE INSURANCE COVERAGE:

Do you have Fire insurance coverage? Please ensure that you have adequate coverage should a fire happen. There are many levels of coverage on an insurance policy.

USED OIL RECYCLING

The R.M. has sourced out a company that will come and pick up your used oil. In order for the company to come to the RM a minimum load is 12,000 liters. If you have oil that needs to be picked up please contact the office at 646-2033 or at admin@rmofmaryfield.com.

BEAVER BOUNTY:

The R.M.'s beaver bounty is \$50 per tail for adult nuisance beavers hunted/trapped within our municipal boundaries. SARM is once again administering a rebate program based on 50:50 cost-share to all RM's to control the beaver population in their respective jurisdictions therefore, IF you have a valid Hunter/Trappers License when you trap the beaver – the RM will then pay you \$65.00 per tail once you have provided the RM office with a copy of said license.

GARBAGE/RECYCLE BINS

Loraas is permitted to accept only solid, non-hazardous waste materials including general household garbage, food, yard and garden waster, etc. They DO NOT accept any regulated waste such as: hazardous waste, medical waste, pressure-filled containers, paint, used oil or containers, or electronics. Please be diligent in using the Garbage and Recycle bins properly. We do not want to lose this service by having the bins removed from the municipality. ALSO, ensure the lids are closed every time - so that garbage is not blowing around the area.

WATER WELL #6

Please be advised that Well #6(SE 33-11-30 W1M) is non-potable effective immediately. If you have any further questions regarding this please contact the office.
